VOCABULARY: FUTURE ASPIRATIONS

- **pass your exams:** aprobar los exámenes
- **pass your driving test:** aprobar el examen de conducir
- **study abroad:** estudiar en el extranjero
- **go on an exchange:** ir de intercambio
- **go backpacking:** viajar "de forma barata"
- **go for an interview:** ir a una entrevista
- **get a holiday job:** conseguir un trabajo de vacaciones
- **get a degree:** obtener un título
- **do voluntary work:** hacer trabajo voluntario
- **do work experience:** hacer prácticas
- **apply for a job:** buscar un trabajo
- **leave home:** independizarse
- **make new friends:** hacer nuevos amigos
- **make money:** hacer dinero (cobrando)

VOCABULARY: TIME MANAGEMENT

- **get organized:** organizarse
- **plan ahead:** planearse
- **make lists:** hacer listas
- **develop a routine:** desarrollar una rutina
- **find a balance:** conseguir un balance
- **prioritize:** priorizar
- **waste time:** perder tiempo
- **take a break:** tomar un descanso
- **put off:** posponer
- **meet a deadline:** cumplir una fecha de entrega
- **set a reminder:** establecer un recordatorio
- **set goals:** establecer objetivos

VOCABULARY: PHRASAL VERBS

*Separable phrasal verbs: ask out, tell off, bring up

- **bring up:** criar, educar
- **look after:** cuidar
- **tell off:** reñir
- **fall out (with):** pelearse, discutir

- **make up (with)**: reconciliarse
- **get on (with)**: llevarse bien
- **ask out**: invitar a
- **go out (with)**: salir con
- **hang out (with)**: reunirse con
- **meet up (with)**: quedar con
- **settle down (with)**: independizarse con
- **split up (with)**: separarse de (relación)

VOCABULARY: NON-VERBAL COMMUNICATION

- **smile**: sonreír
- **raise your eyebrows**: levantar las cejas
- **roll your eyes**: poner los ojos en blanco
- **frown**: fruncir el ceño
- **make eye contact**: mantener contacto visual
- **stare**: mirar fijamente
- **hold hands**: coger de la mano
- **shake hands**: dar la mano
- **give (somebody) a hug**: abrazar (a alguien)
- **kiss (somebody) on the cheek**: dar un beso en la mejilla (a alguien)
- **gesticulate**: gesticular
- **shrug your shoulders**: levantar los hombros

GRAMMAR: FUTURE (SIMPLE) TENSES

***Be about to: estar a punto de**

- **WILL/WON'T**: future predictions, spontaneous decisions, promises, offers
 - (+): Subject + will + v + com.
 - (-): Subject + won't + v + com.
 - (?): Will + subject + v + com.?
- **BE (NOT) GOING TO**: future intentions
 - (+): Subject + be going to + v + com.
 - (-): Subject + be not going to + v + com.
 - (?): Be + subject + going to + v + com.?
- **PRESENT CONTINUOUS**: definite arrangements
 - (+): Subject + be v-ing + com.
 - (-): Subject + be not v-ing + com.
 - (?): Be + subject + v-ing + com.?
- **PRESENT SIMPLE**: schedules and timetables
 - (+): Subject + v(-s) + com.
 - (-): Subject + don't/doesn't v + com.
 - (?): Do/Does + subject + v + com.?

- **MIGHT**: future possibilities
 - (+): Subject + might + v + com.
 - (-): Subject + mightn't + v + com.
 - (?) Might + subject + v + com.?

GRAMMAR: FUTURE CONTINUOUS

To talk about actions in progress.

- (+): Subject + will be v-ing + com.
EX: I will be studying in August.
- (-): Subject + won't be v-ing + com.
EX: I won't be studying in August.
- (?) (WH) Will + subject + be v-ing + com.?
EX: Will I be studying in August?
 - Yes, subject + will
 - No, subject + won't

GRAMMAR: CONDITIONAL SENTENCES

*Had & Would → 'd

- **1st conditional**: possible situations
EX: If you study, you will pass → Si estudias, aprobarás
 - **CONDITION**: If + subject + present simple V,
 - **CONSEQUENCE**: subject + will + v
- **2nd conditional**: hypothetical situations
EX: If you studied, you would pass → Si estudiases, aprobarías
 - **CONDITION**: If + subject + past simple V,
 - **CONSEQUENCE**: subject + would + v
- **3rd conditional**: impossible situations
EX: If you had studied, you would have passed → Si hubieses estudiado, habrías aprobado
 - **CONDITION**: If + subject + past perfect V,
 - **CONSEQUENCE**: subject + would have + participle v

UNLESS = if not = a menos que

If you don't study, you will suspend → Unless you study, you will suspend

ADVICE: 2nd conditional

If I were you, I would... → Si yo fuera tú...

GRAMMAR: ADVERBS OF POSSIBILITY AND PROBABILITY

- **Maybe & Perhaps** (quizás) go at the beginning of the sentence or clause.
- **Definitely (definitivamente) & Probably (probablemente)**:
 - Before negative auxiliaries or negative verb be
 - After positive auxiliaries or positive verb b
